Located on the southern border of Georgia and bisected by Interstate 75 and Interstate 10, Lake City, Florida's Springlands is easy to get to and even easier to get along with. The area has often been called the "Gateway to Florida," welcoming visitors with southern hospitality and natural beauty since 1832. The heart of the county lies in Lake City, the perfect stop-over for short-term guests who are on the move. • A downtown landmark and central hub of hospitality for over 100 years, <u>The Blanche</u> is a 14-room historic boutique hotel that also houses retail, office, co-working and event space as well as two dozen one and two-bedroom apartments. Built in 1902 by architect Frank Pierce Milburn, this was once the most luxurious place to stay in town. Commonly referred to as "the pride of Lake City," The Blanche has hosted plenty of famous guests, from Johnny Cash to Al Capone when they passed through the "gateway to Florida" on their travels. Today, visitors can stay in the same posh accommodations while they explore Columbia County. With no front desk and easy online check-in, this hotel is perfect for visitors looking to get in and out with ease.

Where to Eat

If authentic country dining is what you're looking for, you'll be sure to find it at Shirley's Restaurant, located near downtown Lake City. Pop in for breakfast or lunch at this family-friendly local diner and fill up with a hearty meal, with popular menu offerings including fried green tomatoes, fresh vegetables, fried chicken, country-fried steak, cornbread and homemade desserts.

• Another popular local spot in downtown Lake City is <u>Marion Street Bistro and Brewhouse</u>. Locally inspired and fiercely independent, this gastro-pub and outdoor eatery features rich history and delectable cuisine. Open for lunch and dinner Tuesday through Saturday, you'll find a wide variety of options, from the Marion house-smoked wings to farm-raised elk chops from New Zealand, as well as a selection of homemade desserts. Marion Street also features live entertainment Wednesday through Saturday and offers craft beers and cocktails at their casual chic bar.


 Also centrally located in Florida's Springlands are the 1,000 acres of greenland and wet space that make up <u>Alligator Lake Park</u>. Here, visitors will find a taste of unspoiled, untamed Florida with a beautiful waterfront spot in the underappreciated metropolis of Lake City. A variety of fish can be found in the lake for fishing, including bream/bluegill, redear sunfish, catfish, crappie and largemouth bass. The park also offers 12 miles of hiking and biking trails, canoe trails and launch, picnic pavilions and plenty of opportunities for nature watching.

• Another unique destination is <u>Falling Creek Falls</u>, which is located just a short 10 minute drive north of Lake City. Wander along the boardwalk to find yourself at a magnificent, roaring 10-foot waterfall, which you will hear well before you arrive at the observation deck. Along the way, you'll see beautiful forests of magnolias, sweetgums, and bald cypresses as well as wildlife exploring the peaceful tranquility of the area. The park also offers a playground and picnic area, making it a great place to lose yourself in nature.

Located about 20 minutes north of downtown Lake City is a center that honors the
memory of American composer Stephen Foster, who wrote "Old Folks at Home," the
song that made the Suwannee River famous. Perched on the banks of the river, <u>Stephen
Foster Folk Culture State Park</u> takes visitors back in time, with genuine artifacts from
Foster's life and musical legacy, miles of trails for cyclists and hikers and a 97-bell
carillon, playing more than 200 Stephen Foster melodies.
